## Success at The Factory for Scrapstore

Dorset Scrapstore is celebrating its first eight months of business at The Factory, its new location on Alder Hills in Poole.

Dorset Scrapstore is a charity where manufacturing waste doesn't go to landfill but instead becomes a low cost community resource for craft and creativity.

It first opened in 1999, before moving to the current location in 2010 when it was a Remploy factory. In October 2012 Remploy ceased operations due to government cuts, so Dorset Scrapstore moved to Boscombe.

In April this year it moved back to the Remploy building which has been regenerated by **BCHA** into a social enterprise hub called The Factory run by the New Leaf organisation.

Vanessa Marsh, General Manager at the Dorset Scrapstore, said: "We couldn't be happier about our move to The Factory – business has doubled since opening in April."

The Factory was bought by BCHA in March 2014 and with support from Dorset LEP and The Talbot Village Trust it has been transformed into a

creative space. The store is open from Tuesday to Friday from 11am to 5pm and until 7pm on Wednesday and Thursday.
